#### **CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS**

#### 1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The curriculum designed by the Kavayitri Bahinabai University, Jalgaon is followed by the respective faculties of the institution. The meeting of the academic planning is held at the beginning of the academic year under the guidance of the Principal Dr.A.P.Khairnar for the effective implementation of the curriculum. The institution chalks out an academic calendar to ensure effective curriculum delivery. Faculty members are instructed by the Principal to complete the syllabus in stipulated time. The textbooks and reference books are ordered with the concern subject teachers and students as per the requirement during the academic year. For delivery of the curriculum in the classroom, teachers use the innovative methods i.e. PowerPoint Presentation, seminar, assignments and tutorials. Teachers are also motivated to attend the workshop on curriculum organized by Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University (KBCNMU), Jalgaon. They are guided for adopted Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) patterns by KBCNMU, Jalgaon for First Year Bachelor of Arts (FYBA) w.e.f from June 2018. Our college keeps the updates records of the planned curriculum and receives updates regularly through emails and letters from the university regarding the changes in curriculum. The Principal informs the changes to teachers of concern subjects. The documents of all activities have been recorded safely for the data collection of the institution. Suggestion and recommendations on framed curriculum are put forward by teachers to Board of Studies of each subject in the workshop. The feedback on the curriculum is collected by the students and teachers for SWOT analysis of curriculum. Academic diaries are distributed by the Principal to every faculty of institution. The diary includes a lesson plan, various types of leaves, extracurricular activities, course objectives and outcomes, contents topics to every faculty member for maintaining at the beginning of each

semester. It gives the insight for faculty how the lecture will be delivered throughout the semester. The Head of the department discusses the action plan of curriculum for effective implementation. The academic calendar is prepared as per the academic schedule of the degree programme for effective curriculum delivery and documentation.

2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Continuous Internal Evaluation is an integral part of the overall development of the institution. Our institution believes firmly in a continuous internal evolution system at an institutional level. Hence, the structured evaluation process has been designed and implemented perfectly. Students are made aware of continuous internal evaluation in our institution. For this purpose, the analysis is done by CIE, tests and tutorials are conducted to the reform evaluation process. The bridge courses for eight days are conducted for FYBA students at the beginning of the semester and remedial classes for fifteenth days are conducted for slow learners, absentee in the month of March of every semester as per the scheduled at the college level. The syllabus is framed with the guidance of the Principal of the institution by considering the need of the students. These classes help students to grow their subject knowledge and help them to catch up their skills of listening, speaking reading and writing. The internal examination includes tests, tutorials, practical are conducted in the middle of every semester and external examinations of two hours of a respective subject at the end of the semester as per the schedule of the university.

The academic calendar is prepared for the effective functioning of overall academic work. The academic calendar is made by the academic constitute committee of the institute. The committee includes the Principal as chairperson, IQAC coordination, and Chairman of admission committee of the college. The academic calendar provides important information about curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, teaching plan, holidays, important students oriented activities and the details of the examination. The Principal keeps watching on the academic calendar whether all departments' follow it properly or not.
